






Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve





Fig.2 Maximum Safe Operating Area

Fig.3 Normalized Transient Thermal Resistance vs. Pulse Width








Fig.4 Avalanche Current vs. Inductive Load

Fig.5 Avalanche Energy Derating Curve vs. Junction Temperature







Fig.6 Typical Output Characteristics(I)







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


Fig.8 Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

Fig.9 Typical Transfer Characteristics





Fig.10 Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

Fig.11 Transconductance vs. Drain Current






Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State

Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current(I)





Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature











Fig.15 Typical Capacitance vs. Drain -Source Voltage

Fig.17 Dynamic Input Characteristics



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


Fig.18 Source Current vs. Source-Drain Voltage

## Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit






Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit

#### Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms






Fig.2-2 Gate Charge Waveform





#### Fig.3-2 Avalanche Waveform





