

FIG.1 – FORWARD CURRENT DERATING CURVE




FIG.2 – PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT




FIG.3 – TYPICAL FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS




FIG.4 – TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS




FIG.5 – TYPICAL JUNCTION CAPACITANCE
